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Discipline Summary

Motion Decision

On October 5, 2018, the Discipline Committee granted the College's motion to indefinitely adjourn the discipline hearing of Mr. Khaliqi in relation to a matter in which he was alleged to have engaged in the following acts of professional misconduct:

1. contravening of a Standard of Practice of the profession or a published standard of the College, or failing to maintain the Standard of Practice of the profession;
2. falsifying a record relating to the registrant's practice;
3. signing or issuing, in the registrant's professional capacity, a document that the registrant knows contains a false or misleading statement;
4. submitting an account or charge for services that the registrant knows is false or misleading;
5. charging or accepting a fee or amount that is excessive or unreasonable in relation to the services performed;
6. engaging in conduct or performing an act relevant to the practice of the profession that, having regard to all the circumstances, would reasonably be regarded by registrants as disgraceful, dishonourable or unprofessional; and/or
7. engaging in conduct that would reasonably be regarded by registrants as conduct unbecoming a Massage Therapist.

The Panel granted the motion after the College explained that Mr. Khaliqi had entered into an undertaking to resign and never reapply for registration with the College. In that undertaking, the Registrant also acknowledged that 1) he was under investigation for three other matters, all of which involved allegations of sexual abuse, and 2) that the College could prosecute Mr. Khaliqi if he were to breach this undertaking.
