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## Discipline Summary Nikolce Ilievski (Hamilton, ON) March 31, 2020

## **Motion Decision**

On March 31, 2020, the Discipline Committee granted a consent motion to indefinitely adjourn the discipline hearing of Mr. Nikolce Ilievski, in relation to a matter in which he was alleged to have engaged in the following acts of professional misconduct:

- 1. sexual abuse of a client;
- 2. contravention of a Standard of Practice of the profession or a published standard of the College, or failed to maintain the Standard of Practice of the profession;
- doing anything to a client for a therapeutic, preventative, palliative, cosmetic or other health-related purpose in a situation in which a consent is required by law, without such consent;
- 4. engaging in conduct or performed an act relevant to the practice of the profession that, having regard to all the circumstances, would reasonably be regarded by registrants as disgraceful, dishonourable or unprofessional; and/or
- 5. engaging in conduct that would reasonably be regarded by members as conduct unbecoming a Massage Therapist.

The Discipline Committee granted the motion after the parties explained that Mr. Ilievski had signed an undertaking to resign and never reapply for registration with the College. In that undertaking the College retained the right to prosecute Mr. Ilievski if he were to breach the undertaking. Mr. Ilievski also agreed to reimburse the College for funding and post security in the amount of \$8,000.00, to guarantee the payment for funding provided to the client for therapy and counselling.
