Discipline Hearing Summary – Weijing Song, RMT (Greater Toronto Area, ON)

August 18, 2017

Decision

On August 18, 2017, the Discipline Committee found that Ms. Weijing Song, a Registered Massage Therapist (RMT), committed acts of professional misconduct in that she:

1. Contravened a Standard of Practice of the profession or a published standard of the College, or failed to maintain the Standard of Practice of the profession;
2. Falsified a record relating to the member's practice;
3. Signed or issued, in the member's professional capacity, a document that the member knew contained a false or misleading statement;
4. Submitted an account or charge for services that the member knew was false or misleading; and
5. Engaged in conduct or performed an act, relevant to the practise of the profession, that, having regard to all the circumstances, would reasonably be regarded by members as disgraceful, dishonourable or unprofessional.

Penalty Order and Cost Award Imposed

The Discipline Committee made the following order:

1. Ms. Song is required to receive a public and recorded reprimand;
2. The Registrar is directed to suspend Ms. Song's Certificate of Registration for a period of six (6) months, with three (3) months of the suspension remitted if she complies with the provisions of paragraph three (3) by November 18, 2017;
3. The Registrar is directed to impose the following specified terms, conditions, and limitations on Ms. Song's Certificate of Registration:
 - a. Requiring that Ms. Song successfully complete a record keeping course, pre-approved by the Registrar;
 - b. Requiring that Ms. Song successfully complete an ethics course, pre-approved by the Registrar, at her own expense.
4. Ms. Song is required to pay to the College costs in the amount of \$2,000.00 within six (6) months of the date of the Discipline Committee's order.
