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Discipline Motion Summary

Registrant C

October 8, 2021

Motion Decision

On October 8, 2021, the Discipline Committee heard a motion to withdraw the allegations of professional misconduct brought against Registrant C, a Registered Massage Therapist (RMT). The Discipline Committee granted the motion, which was brought forward by the College and Registrant C, and withdrew the following allegations:

- 1. contravening of a Standard of Practice of the profession or a published standard of the College, or failure to maintain the standard of practice of the profession;
- 2. falsifying of a record relating to his practice;
- 3. signing or issuing, in his professional capacity, a document that he knew contained a false or misleading statement; and/or
- engaging in conduct or performing an act relevant to the practice of the profession that, having regard to all the circumstances, would reasonably be regarded by registrants as disgraceful, dishonourable or unprofessional.

These allegations were withdrawn after the College explained that this conduct, coming in the form of a client complaint, had also been the subject of a Registrar's report. The Discipline Committee considered the allegations stemming from the Registrar's report during a separate proceeding on October 8, 2021 and found that Registrant C engaged in these acts of misconduct. As such, it would be unfair to proceed with a hearing about the same allegations because Registrant C had already been sanctioned for them.
