# **Discipline Summary**

# Jin Min Huang (Burlington, ON)

#### **April 12, 2022**

#### **Motion Decision**

On April 12, 2022, the Discipline Committee granted a request brought by the College and Ms. Huang to indefinitely postpone the discipline hearing. The hearing related to a matter in which it was alleged that Ms. Huang engaged in the following acts of professional misconduct:

- 1. sexual abuse of a client, particularly touching of a sexual nature of the client by the registrant;
- contravening a Standard of Practice of the profession or a published Standard of the College, or failing to maintain the Standard of Practice of the profession, in particular the Standard for Maintaining Professional Boundaries and Preventing Sexual Abuse and/or Communication/Public Health Standard 6: Obtain, Update and Record the Client's Health History and/or Communication/Public Health Standard 7: Consent;
- 3. abusing a client verbally or physically;
- 4. failing to keep records as required;
- 5. falsifying a record relating to the registrant's practice;
- 6. signing or issuing, in the registrant's professional capacity, a document that the registrant knows contains a false or misleading statement;
- 7. contravening clause 27(2)4 of the Regulated Health Professions Act, 1991; and/or
- 8. engaging in conduct or performing an act relevant to the practice of the profession that, having regard to all the circumstances, would reasonably be regarded by registrants as disgraceful, dishonourable or unprofessional.

The Discipline Committee granted the request after it was presented with evidence that Ms. Huang signed an <u>undertaking</u> to resign and never reapply for registration with the College. According to that undertaking, the College retains the right to prosecute Ms. Huang if she breaches any of its terms.
