Discipline Summary

Haomiao Liu (North York, ON)

October 11, 2022

Motion Decision

On October 11, 2022, the Discipline Committee granted a request brought by the College and Mr. Liu to indefinitely adjourn Mr. Liu's discipline hearing. The hearing related to a matter in which it was alleged that he engaged in the following acts of professional misconduct:

- contravention of a Standard of Practice of the profession or a published Standard of the College, or failure to maintain the Standard of Practice of the profession, in particular, the Communication/Public Health Standard 6: Obtain, Update and Record the Client's Health History and Communication/Public Health Standard 14: Client Health Record;
- 2. failure to keep records as required;
- 3. falsifying a record related to his practice;
- 4. signing or issuing, in his professional capacity, a document that he knows contains a false or misleading statement;
- 5. submitting an account or charge for services that he knows is false or misleading;
- contravention of the Massage Therapy Act, 1991, the Regulated Health Professions Act, 1991 or the regulations under either of those Acts, in particular section 8 of Ontario Regulation 544/94 under the Massage Therapy Act, 1991 (i.e., keeping a daily appointment record); and/or
- 7. engaging in conduct or performing an act relevant to the practice of the profession that, having regard to all the circumstances, would reasonably be regarded by registrants as disgraceful, dishonourable or unprofessional.

The Discipline Committee granted the request after it was presented with evidence that Mr. Liu signed an <u>undertaking</u> to resign and never reapply for registration with the College. According to that undertaking, the College can re-open the prosecution of this matter if Mr. Liu reapplies for registration with the College or otherwise breaches any of the other terms of the undertaking. The allegations remain unproven.
