Prometric does not share this information with CMTO, therefore, for the purposes of registration CMTO requires proof of graduation in the form of a transcript as part of the initial registration application. A comprehensive review of CMTO's Refresher Course policy was undertaken in 2022. The Refresher Course Policy was updated to reduce the number of tutoring hours required, permit more tutoring hours to be completed remotely and incorporate CMTO's new jurisprudence program, offered on-demand and totaling 4-5 hours of completion in place of the Standards and Regulations E-Workshop, offered four times a year and four weeks in length. There will be no fee to take the Jurisprudence Program. The updated policy will be effective January 1, 2023.

CMTO's Language fluency Policy was amendment to remove CanTEST and TESTcan test options, and to include the CELPIP – General test accepted by the federal government for the purposes of immigration. These changes take effect January 1, 2023. Applicants whose first language is not English or French will not experience unnecessary delays in the application process. By accepting language tests that are accepted for the purposes of immigration, some applicants may find that they do not need to complete another language test, saving them time and money prior to registration with CMTO. It is also in the public interest for CMTO to meet its regulatory obligations by complying with directives from the Ministry of Health.

Acupuncture Education and Authorization Policy was move out of the Standard of Practice in September 2022 and became a stand-alone policy. The policy was updated to articulate the administrative requirements and process related to acupuncture authorization and confirmed acupuncture education programs. Because acupuncture is a controlled act, the requirements that must be met by an RMT to perform acupuncture must be clear and easily accessible to clients as well as RMT. The policy is linked on the Acupuncture Standard web page and clearly articulates the requirements.

CMTO received evidence of exam candidates who had access to live 2022 OSCE scenarios prior to taking their exam. The 36 exam candidates for whom there was evidence of cheating, had their exam score invalidated and were not permitted to take the OSCE exam again in 2022. CMTO continues to work with Prometric (exam provider) on mitigation measures to reduce the incidents and/or impact of cheating.
